

The Youth Achievement Awards are an innovative approach to recognising and accrediting young people's achievements not only within a variety of community settings that take place outside their school time such as volunteering, youth work, active citizenship, sports, drama, music, etc but also that take place within their school time, as part of their school curriculum.

ARE FOR 14–25 YEAR OLDS

THEY COME IN 4 LEVELS:



BRONZE – you take part in activities (equivalent to a SQA Standard Grade at General Level)

SILVER – you help organise activities (equivalent to a SQA Standard Grade at Credit Level)





GOLD – you plan, organise and lead your own activities (equivalent to a SQA Higher)

PLATINUM – you take on a leadership role (equivalent to a SQA Advanced Higher)
