# Minute of the Meeting of Stronsay Community Council held in the Island Link Office and via Teams on Thursday, 1 September 2022 at 19:00

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# **1. NHS Orkney Presentation**

The Chair of NHS Orkney Board, the Executive Medical Director and the Chief Officer of Orkney Health and Care informed members that NHS Orkney had undertaken a detailed investigation into the inappropriate accessing of medical records affecting a number of Stronsay residents. All those affected had been contacted and processes had been followed to the satisfaction of the Information Commissioner's Office.

The three NHS dignitaries left the meeting at this point.
