There is a degree of uncertainty regarding the powers which will be attached to MEP status but it could act as a lever in future Government policy and decision making.

To work with Government to establish the range of practical functions that the Marine Energy Park status could have, including acting as a basis for future planning and administrative processes which could improve the environment for development of the renewables sector in Orkney.

MEP status would create a positive business environment to attract investment which would generate jobs and business opportunities for Orkney and the surrounding area as well as securing low carbon energy.
How have stakeholders been involved in the development of this function/policy/plan?	During 2011 the Chief Executive and Executive Director of Development and Infrastructure worked closely with Highland Council, HIE and Scottish Government officials to promote the Pentland Firth and Orkney Waters area as having the key credentials to

	qualify for Marine Energy Park status.
	The promotional activity included a presentation to the UK Marine Energy Programme Board. The UK Marine Energy Programme was established by the UK Government in 2011 to focus on enhancing the UK marine energy sector's ability to develop and deploy wave and tidal energy devices on a commercial scale. The Programme aims to put in place a coherent programme of policies across Government, led by the Department of Energy and Climate Change (DECC), to enable the UK Marine Energy sector to move from prototype testing to commercial deployment over the coming 5 years; and provide a direct link between DECC Ministers and sector stakeholders. Work is ongoing to ensure that the next Programme Board meeting includes a significant part of the agenda in Orkney.
