The service is carried out under the PSO contract which will be up for renewal on 1 April 2013.

State who is, or may be affected by this function/policy/plan, and how	The island communities rely on transport by air and ferry for social inclusion purposes. The timetable therefore aims to provide the best level of service where possible to all islands.
	The proposed drop to Eday on a Monday morning will be beneficial to the S1/2 KGS pupils on the island as they will be able to stay an extra night at home. This is on par with the level of service provided to North Ronaldsay and Papa Westray pupils.
How have stakeholders been involved in the development of this function/policy/plan?	The timetables were discussed at the Air Services Consultative Committee meeting in August. Transport Representatives from each island community have provided comments and amendments have been

	made to the timetable where possible.

How could you minimise or remove any potential negative impacts?	Although there are no differential impacts to be addressed it should be noted that the proposed drop to Eday is a negative for the North Ronaldsay community who currently received this as a dedicated flight. In order to minimise the impact of the drop, the provision will be for the 3 pupils during term time only. The North Ronaldsay community will therefore have a dedicated service during the school holidays. It should also be noted that as the pupils are of 11 years of age, the flight is capable of carrying 9 passengers instead of 8.
