The LBAP provides a summary of recent changes to environmental legislation and policy and identifies further objectives, targets and actions for a set of 10 Habitat Action Plans. Appendices to the Plan provide further information on priority habitats and species that are known to occur in Orkney as well as a list of internationally recognised goals and targets for biodiversity conservation.
