THE ORKNEY ISLANDS COUNCIL (40 MPH SPEED LIMIT) (TOAB) ORDER 2002

The Orkney Islands Council in exercise of its powers under Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1 This Order may be cited as The Orkney Islands Council (40 mph Speed Limit) (Toab) Order 2002 and shall come into operation on the First day of June Two Thousand and Two.
- 2 The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3 No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding forty miles per hour in any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

SCHEDULE

- (a) That part of the public road A960 leading from Kirkwall to Deerness from a point sixty five metres or thereby westnorthwest of its junction with the public road B9052 Hurtiso Road to a point fifty metres or thereby east of the access road to Brough, St Andrews, a distance of one thousand one hundred metres or thereby
- (b) That part of the public road B9052 Hurtiso Road from its junction with the public road A960 leading from Kirkwall to Decrness to a point twenty metres or thereby southsouthwest of the access road to Easthouse, St Andrews, a distance of two hundred and thirty metres or thereby
- (c) That part of the unclassified Old Voy Road from its junction with the public road A960 leading from Kirkwall to Deerness in a southsoutheasterly direction for a distance of twenty metres or thereby
