

Recycling Centres - What and Where to Recycle

The Recycling Centres (Civic Amenity Sites) are provided for **domestic use only**. There is a **height** restriction barrier (approximately 2 metres) in place at all recycling centres. The information below details what can be recycled at each site:

Deerness

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Dounby

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass, paper, textiles (clothes and shoes), garden waste and household batteries.

Eday, beyond Pier

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Firth, Cursiter

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass, paper, textiles (clothes and shoes), garden waste, household batteries, scrap metal, vehicle batteries, weee, cardboard, waste oil, tetra pak cartons fluorescent tubes (incl. Energy bulbs) and plastic bottles.

Flotta Pier

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Houton Pier

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Hoy, beyond Pier

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Kirkwall, Hatston

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass, paper, textiles (clothes and shoes), garden waste, household batteries, scrap metal, vehicle batteries, weee, cardboard, waste oil, tetra pak cartons, fluorescent tubes (incl. Energy bulbs) and plastic bottles.

Kirkwall, Hordaland

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass, paper and textiles (clothes and shoes).

Kirkwall, Lidl Supermarket

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass, paper, textiles (clothes and shoes) and tetra pak cartons.

Kirkwall, Papdale shop

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Kirkwall, Tesco

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

North Ronaldsay, beyond pier

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Papa Westray, beyond Pier

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Rousay, beyond Pier

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Sanday, Kettletoft Village

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Shapinsay, Pier

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass, paper, textiles (clothes and shoes), garden waste, household batteries, scrap metal, vehicle batteries, weee, cardboard, waste oil, tetra pak cartons, fluorescent tubes (incl. Energy bulbs) and plastic bottles.

Textiles (Clothes and Shoes)

Stromness, Garson

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass, paper, textiles (clothes and shoes), garden waste, household batteries, scrap metal, vehicle batteries, weee, cardboard, waste oil, tetra pak cartons, fluorescent tubes (incl. Energy bulbs) and plastic bottles.

Stronsay Pier

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

Tankerness, Bossack

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass, paper, textiles (clothes and shoes), garden waste, household batteries, scrap metal, vehicle batteries, weee, cardboard, waste oil, tetra pak cartons, fluorescent tubes (incl. Energy bulbs), plastic bottles and cooking oil.

Westray, Pierowall

Cans (aluminium and steel), glass and paper.

General information

Each waste type has to be placed into the correct container. Please observe the signs onsite as materials placed in the wrong container could contaminate the contents making them non-recyclable.

Commercial waste is **not permitted** and must be taken to Chinglebraes Waste Transfer Station. Inert waste (e.g. stones, soil, etc.) must be taken to Bossack Landfill Site. Please refer to the Commercial Waste section of the council's website for any details.

All materials collected separately and without contamination are recycled by Orkney Islands Council.
