

THE ORKNEY ISLANDS COUNCIL (40 MPH SPEED LIMIT) (BURRAY) ORDER 1993

The Orkney Islands Council in exercise of its powers under Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, with the consent of the Secretary of State under Part II of Schedule 9 to the Act, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1 This Order may be cited as The Orkney Islands Council (40 mph Speed Limit)(Burray) Order 1993 and shall come into operation on the first day of May Nineteen Hundred and Ninety Three.
- 2 The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3 No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding forty miles per hour on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

SCHEDULE

That part of the public road A961 leading from Kirkwall to Burwick at Burray from a point one hundred metres or thereby north of its junction with the unclassified public road leading to Burray Village at Burray Primary School firstly in a southeasterly direction, thereafter in an eastnortheasterly direction and finally again in a southeasterly direction to a point two hundred and thirty six metres or thereby south east of the entrance to the property known as Addage, Burray, a total distance of eight hundred and fifteen metres or thereby
