## THE ORKNEY ISLANDS COUNCIL (40 MPH SPEED LIMIT) (HILLSIDE ROAD, DOUNEY) ORDER 1999

The Orkney Islands Council in exercise of its powers under Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Fart III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

- This Order may be cited as The Orkney Islands Council (40 mph Speed Limit) (Hillside Road, Dounby) Order 1999 and shall come into operation on the First day of April Wineteen Hundred and Minety Nine.
- The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3 No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding forty miles per hour in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
