**Empty Homes Support Scheme.** 

Report by Director of Education, Communities and Housing.



# 1. Overview

- 1.1. On 4 June 2025, the Education, Leisure and Housing Committee recommended approval, in principle, of the Empty Homes Support Scheme. In summary this relates to the provision of a loan of up to £25,000, to be made available to the owners of empty homes, providing they have had an empty home for at least 12 months.
- 1.2. Detailed procedures will be developed by the Head of Strategic Housing, Housing Operations and Homelessness and the Head of Finance, in consultation with the Head of Corporate Governance, to align with the Financial Regulations, Contract Standing Orders, Subsidy Control rules and relevant legislation, specifically the Housing (Scotland) Act 2006 which enables councils to award housing loans in certain situations including to improve property condition. Loan conditions will exceed the statutory provisions, specifically to ensure properties are let to essential workers through a private residential tenancy in exchange for a loan being provided.
- 1.3. The Scheme proposes a loan, up to a maximum of £25,000 per property, to bring the property up to the statutory Repairing Standard. The loan must be repaid within 5 years, with conditions attached for its use for 10 years. The loan allocation will be funded by an agreed commitment from the Strategic Reserve Fund, with this budget limiting the number of loan applications.
- 1.4. The level of loan award will be dependent on the condition of the relevant empty home and the works required to meet the Repairing Standard.
- 1.5. The Scheme will be reviewed after five years of operation, or before as required, for example if funding for the scheme were fully allocated.
- 1.6. To implement the Empty Homes Support Scheme, it is proposed that a budget totalling £1m over 5 years (equivalent to £200k per year) be set aside within the Strategic Reserve Fund. If demand exceeds the annual budget, additional funding can be brought forward from the Strategic Reserve Fund to match the

commitment. If demand is lower than the £200k annual budget, the remainder would move into the following year so that the commitment would not be lost. Interest will be applied to loans at a rate agreed by the Head of Finance. Loan and interest repayments are expected to be repaid on a monthly basis.

# 2. Recommendations

- 2.1. It is recommended that members of the Committee:
  - i. Agree that a total budget of £1m, comprising £200k per annum over a 5 year period, be allocated from the Strategic Reserve Fund in order to fund the Empty Homes Support Scheme.

### **Implications of Report**

- requires to be identified. A budget totalling £1m (£200k per annum for 5 years) is sought which would provide for up to 40 loans if the maximum award of £25k were sought in each case. The loans would be repaid, with interest, over a period of 5 years. The rent received by the private landlord, who holds the loan, would be used to repay the loan. Accordingly, requirements are placed on the landlord to ensure that the properties are leased to essential workers in line with the Scheme's requirements.
- 2. **Legal** Detailed procedures will be developed between Housing, Finance and Legal officers to implement the Scheme. The Housing (Scotland) Act 2006 enables local authorities to use grants or loans to improve housing conditions in their area. Any loan would be capable of being secured over the property that the loan relates to.
