THE ORKNEY ISLANDS COUNCIL (VARIABLE 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT) (B9052, TOAB, ST ANDREWS) ORDER 2015

The Orkney Islands Council in exercise of its powers under Section 84(1) and (1A) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

- This Order may be cited as The Orkney Islands Council (Variable 20 mph Speed Limit) (B9052, Toab, St Andrews) Order 2015 and shall come into operation on the Seventeenth day of August Two Thousand and Fifteen.
- The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament. In this Order, the expression "vehicle" means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along a road whether or not by mechanical power.
- 3 (a) No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle in the length of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order at a speed exceeding:-
 - (i) twenty miles per hour at a time when such a speed limit is indicated by a traffic sign in accordance with Article 3(b) hereof; or
 - (ii) forty miles per hour at any other time.
 - (b) Such an indication may be given between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and at no other time.
- This Order, where its provisions conflict, supersedes the Order specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.


